Sinepuxent Avenue bike lane project: some stop signs to change locations

At the CWCA board of directors meeting in January, Paul Mouser of the Ocean City Engineering Department provided an update on the bike route project planned for Sinepuxent Avenue.

The town has received a \$57,000 grant from the Maryland Bikeways Program for the project.

Five-foot-wide bike lanes will be created on Sinepuxent Avenue from 130th Street to 146th Street. Parallel parking will be available along Sinepuxent.

The stop signs currently located in the north/south direction at 135th, 137th, 138th, 140th and 141st streets will be changed to east/west.

Stop signs on Sinepuxent at 130th, 133rd, 136th, 139th and 142nd Streets will remain in their current locations;

these streets have traffic signals where they intersect Coastal Highway.

Signs will be placed in these areas to warn drivers of the changes in the traffic pattern. The project is comparable to St. Louis Avenue.

The project should be completed by Memorial Weekend.

Police warn of computer scams

The Ocean City Police Department has recently seen an increase in reports of computer scams.

In each case, the victim reported being contacted in some way by an online computer repair company stating that their

computer had a virus that needed to be removed. The victim then paid the company hundreds of dollars through either a wire transfer, gift cards, or a fictitious online payment



system. One victim lost nearly \$1,000 before contacting police.

In most cases, the scammer gained remote access to the computer and rather than fix it, the scammer created a virus.

Internet crime schemes such as these steal millions of dollars each year from unsuspecting victims across the country. The OCPD offers a few simple steps to spot similar scams:

- Be cautious of unsolicited offers. If you didn't ask for computer repair services, a legitimate company would not have known that it was needed.
- Be wary if the seller accepts only wire transfers, gift cards or cash.
- When asked to pay with a credit card through a website, ensure the site is secure and reputable before providing your credit card number.
- Research the company before agreeing to the service. Most legitimate companies will have information about their company online, as well as customer reviews.

Dog park available for OC residents and non-residents

The Town of Ocean City's dog playground on 94th Street bayside can be used by both residents and non-residents.

The playground is divided into two sections — one for dogs 28 pounds and under, and one for dogs over 28 pounds — and can be used from dawn to dusk, seven days a week, weather and conditions permitting.

All dogs must have a current license and vaccination certificate. Also, proof of residency or property ownership is required for a resident pass.

To apply for a permit and for a list of costs, please visit www.oceancitymd.gov/oc/departments/recreation-parks. You can also call or visit the front desk at Northside Park on 125th Street bayside, 410-250-0125, during regular business hours.

Do you rent out your property?

If you rent your property to anyone at any time, the law requires you to obtain an Ocean City rental license and an OC noise control permit. This is to maintain the character of single-family residential districts and assure compliance with all laws,

ordinances and regulations, while also ensuring safe, healthy and habitable housing conditions in rental housing units.

Failure to obtain required permits can result in substantial fines

Applications may be obtained at City Hall or by calling 410-289-8833. Properties that may be in violation of rental license, safety, building or health regulations should be reported to the P.R.E.S.S Committee at 410-289-8855.

MVA Mobile Office coming to OC

The ezMVA Mobile Office will be at the Ocean City Public Safety Building on 66th Street from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. as follows: March 7, April 11, May 9 and June 6.

The following services are available: renew a non-commercial Maryland driver's license and photo ID card (for non-drivers only); obtain a duplicate driver's license, certified copy of a driving record or disability placards; renew vehicle registration; obtain substitute stickers or registration cards; return tags; change your name and/or address; apply to register to vote; register as an organ donor.

Drop off your old drugs at OCPD

Don't know what to do with those old medications that have been hiding in the back of your medicine cabinet for months, or even years?

Take them to the drug drop-off box in the lobby of the Public Safety Building on 65th Street bayside. They will be disposed of properly, no questions asked.

OCPD reminder: Lock your vehicles

The Ocean City Police Department reminds residents and visitors to lock their vehicles after a series of vehicle break-ins throughout the resort. All of the vehicles involved were left unlocked at the time of the incident.

Citizens should also take the following steps to avoid becoming a victim:

- Never leave valuables in a vehicle. If items are left in plain sight inside a vehicle, the chances of a vehicle break-in increase dramatically.
- Place items out of sight before reaching your destination. Criminals may be watching while you hide valuables under a seat or in the trunk.
- Remove phone chargers, suction cups that hold GPS units, and other traces of any valuables.

- Ensure that alarms and anti-theft devices are working. These will act as deterrents and could decrease your chances of becoming a victim.
- Never leave keys in your vehicle. Even if you think they are well hidden, an experienced criminal knows the best hiding places.

Citizens who believe they may be a victim of a vehicle breakin should call local police immediately and avoid rummaging through the vehicle prior to the arrival of police.

Caine Woods history: 1993-1994

In addition to our usual donations, we had a request for \$500 to help out after Hurricane Andrew for Ocean City. The board also voted to donate \$4,000 to Ocean City to go toward the building of North Surf Park. But because the facility will affect the nearby neighbors, the donation was made with the understanding that we could have a say in what facilities will be at the park.

Our insurance bill was approximately \$2,000 for 1993-1994. The previous year was the first time we could get insurance for the board members.

The association purchased a 36-inch gas grill for our picnics and voted to change the guest charge from \$5 to \$10. Discussion started about a picnic in September. The President's Appreciation Party for the officers and board was deleted from the budget; all volunteers who work to make Caine Woods a great place are appreciated.

The OC Police Department started a program in the fall of 1994 to familiarize civilians with the workings of the department and the criminal justice system. It took place one night a week for 13 weeks.

An off-duty policeman received a call on a Friday night about a peeping Tom on South Surf Road. Please, when you need police assistance, call the police department, not an off-duty cop!

The Delaware Department of Transported placed a sign on Route 54 that directed eastbound traffic onto 142nd Street through Caine Woods, as an alternative route to Coastal Highway. The board requested that DelDOT remove it.

DelDOT was considering ways to improve Route 54 because it often floods. One option to raise funds for the roadwork was to make Route 54 a toll road to all but Delaware residents.

Dorothy Brubach put together a welcome basket program for new residents of Caine Woods. She contacted real estate agents to ask that they let prospective buyers know we have an association.

April 16 was clean-up day, and the city provided bulk pickup. On April 29, the new Public Safety Building was dedicated. Plans were in place for the October dinner-dance at the Sheraton Hotel.


The city received a grant to have three bicycle patrol officers; Brett Case was assigned to Caine Woods. He offered to perform security checks of homes and provide suggestions on home security. The city was applying for a grant to provide portable telephones for the bicycle officers.

Discussion was under way for a third entry sign at the west end of 142nd Street.
