As of this writing, the project was approved and will be completed in phases. We will continue to monitor this situation.

CWCA selects St. Peter's Open Kettle for its 2018 charity

Every year, the officers and directors of the Caine Woods Community Association choose a local charity that will receive the proceeds from our September special event and from raffles held at other association events.

The mission of the Open Kettle kitchen and emergency pantry is to feed the hungry in our community. A free lunch is served every Wednesday, year-round, to 100 to 200 people at the church located at 10501 Coastal Highway. In addition to the free lunches, more than 100 bags of groceries are distributed each week to those in need.

We look forward to working with this group and hope to have a successful fundraising effort this year!

Fiesta Park clean-up April 7

In conjunction with the Town of Ocean City's annual bulk pickup project April 7-8, the Caine Woods Community Associa-

tion will hold its traditional spring clean-up of Fiesta Park Saturday, April 7, beginning at 10 a.m.

CWCA volunteers will pick up trash and litter, rake up pine cones and do whatever is needed to make the park the natural resource that it is in Caine Woods. The Ocean City Recreation and Parks Department will provide a crew, supplies and other gear to help out with the clean-up.

Burgers, hot dogs, refreshments and other goodies will be provided to all who help.

Volunteers should bring gloves and rakes. In the past, a crew of up to 20 completed the clean-up in about two hours.

Reminder: Trailer, boat, RV parking

Please remember the following ordinance regarding trailers



and oversized vehicles:
No trailer or oversized
vehicle parking is allowed on
Baltimore Avenue at any time.

• No trailer or oversized vehicle may park on any street or public lot without a permit between May 1 and Oct. 31, except the 100th

Street municipal lot and the West Ocean City Park and Ride.

• Permits are available to registered participants of certain special events from event promoters including Cruisin' Ocean City, OC Bikefest and Endless Summer Cruisin' for a fee of \$50.

• Other permits will be issued on a case-by-case basis by the Town of Ocean City's Director of Special Events.

• The ordinance applies to trailers that are both attached and detached from vehicles.

• An oversized vehicle is any vehicle that is either over 21 feet, 2 inches in length and/or over 6 feet, 8 inches in width.

• The fine for trailer and oversized vehicle violations is \$250.

• Scofflaws (three or more outstanding tickets or \$100 or more in outstanding fines) may be booted or towed.

Senior citizen bus passes available

Residents and property owners age 60 and over are eligible for senior bus passes. The pass allows free rides on city buses and ADA van (if eligible).

Free rides on the seasonal Boardwalk trams are permitted from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m. on non-holiday dates; a reduced fare is offered from 4 p.m. to closing. The cost is \$7 and the pass is valid for two years.

Applications for bus passes and renewals require proof of age, residency or property ownership, such as an Ocean City tax bill or driver's license with an Ocean City address.

A non-resident bus pass is available free of charge to anyone age 60 or older. This pass entitles the holder to half-fare passage on the bus and ADA van (if eligible). The pass is not recognized for reduced or free passage on the trams.

Neither pass applies to MEDTRN service. For more information, call City Hall at 410-289-8221.

The Town of Ocean City's winter schedule for waste wheelers will continue until May 11. Trash is now collected on Tuesdays only. Twice-weekly collection (Tuesdays and Fridays) will resume May 11.

Board members were Tom Collins, Jack Nickels, Richard Atkinson, Diane Fritschle, David McCloskey, Linda Perlozzo, Dorothy Brubach, Ellen Glagola.

The newsletter editors were Ronnie and Fred Schneemans, and the auditor was Stan Buddenbohn.

This year, the police selected names of five policeman to be voted on by Crime Watch Coordinators for Policeman of the Year.

Margaret Sas gave an update on the bike patrol; Caine Woods will probably have to share a patrol with Montego Bay, Little Salisbury and the Jamestown Road area.

Because the neighborhood dance was canceled, the Sheraton Hotel returned our \$500 deposit.

The board approved rolling the certificate of deposit over. It also voted to donate \$25 to the Stephen Decatur High School Band to go toward its trip to the Florida Disney Parade, and to donate \$500 to help the city plant cherry trees on 142nd Street.

The OC Beautification Committee worked with the city to have businesses maintain their landscaping. City codes were enforced on cluttered, weed-covered vacant lots and deteriorating properties.

The annual Christmas caroling and party was at the Tiburon on Dec. 12.

It was rumored that the OC Transportation Department wants a bus station in North Ocean City, probably on the Catholic church property on Coastal Highway.

The city-wide clean-up, including the Fiesta Park clean-up, was April 12. City trucks picked up bulk items placed at the curb free of charge. More than three loads of bulk material were removed from the park and surrounding area.

The CWCA was in need of a newsletter chairman. The board voted to produce the newsletter three times a year instead of four times.

National Night Out would consist of six or seven block parties spread out over Caine Woods on Aug. 5.

Do you rent out your property?

If you rent your property to anyone at any time, the law requires you to obtain an Ocean City rental license and an OC noise control permit. This is to maintain the character of singlefamily residential districts and assure compliance with all laws, ordinances and regulations, while also ensuring safe, healthy and habitable housing conditions in rental housing units.

Applications may be obtained at City Hall or by calling 410-289-8833.

Properties that may be in violation of rental license or a safety, building or health code should be reported to the P.R.E.S.S Committee at 410-289-8855.
