Message from CWCA President Brian Shane

When people think of Ocean City, Maryland, their first thought is usually our most popular attractions: the beach and boardwalk. But in my opinion, there's another massively popular event in Ocean City that comes really close in popularity. It's been going strong here in Ocean City for decades. Here's a hint: it's the one day of the year when everyone's Irish.

I'm talking, of course, about Ocean City's annual St. Patrick's Parade, one of my most favorite events. It's special for me, not just as an OC resident, but as someone proud to celebrate my Irish-American heritage. My great-greatgrandmother's family emigrated from Belfast in the 1880s, and my family tree is now littered with the likes of McWades, O'Connors, Quinns, and Fitzgeralds.

St. Patrick's parade weekend always feels to me like the unofficial end of our chilly off-season slumber, and a welcome step forward into springtime. Now, we certainly don't always get spring-like weather — a few years back, the paradeday temperatures dipped into the low 30s, for example — but it doesn't stop people from packing the town and throwing one doozy of a party.

Speaking of the luck of the Irish, we're so lucky here in 2023 to have our parade back after three consecutive years with-

out it. The COVID-19 pandemic forced a cancellation in 2020 and 2021. Then, organizers had to cancel in 2022 when we had nasty, un-parade-able weather.

Since 1980, the Delmarva Irish American Club has not only produced the parade, but has raised hundreds of thousands of dollars for charitable efforts like scholarships for college-bound high-schoolers. With the parade back on track, so too, can the club resume its invaluable fundraising efforts for our community.

So, let's raise a pint of Guinness and toast the return of a beloved tradition. If you need to find me at the parade March 11, I'll be the one dressed in green. Slainte!

CERT training begins March 9

Citizens can make a difference for their families by enrolling in the Community Emergency Response Team training course that begins Thursday, March 9, at the Ocean City Public Safety Building, 6501 Coastal Hwy.

Community Emergency Response Team training is designed to help citizens help themselves and their families in the event of a catastrophic disaster.

Because emergency services personnel will not be able to help everyone immediately following a disaster, CERT is a free training course that aims to provide citizens with basic information for preparedness and techniques when dealing with emergencies.

This training covers basic skills including CPR/AED, first aid, recognizing natural and manmade hazards, disaster preparedness such as emergency plans and disaster supply kits, hazardous material emergencies and basic fire suppression.

The course is being offered by the Ocean City Emergency Services Department and is also part of the town's Ocean City University program. Those who complete this CERT course, a 16-week general studies program through OC University as well as

the Citizens Police Academy, can earn a Ph.D. certificate from the Town of Ocean City.

Training will run each Thursday evening for seven weeks, ending April 27. To register, contact Emergency Management at 410-723-6616.

Caine Woods history: 2005-2006

CWCA officers for 2005-2006 were Joe Coleman, president; June McCann, vice-president; Tonja Sas, treasurer; Robert LeMay, secretary; Margaret Sas, then Mary Ann LeMay, corresponding secretary.

CWCA directors were Henry Ammermann, Jim Aschenback, Frank Buscemi, Irene Hansen, Rich Hansen, Fran Kennedy, Mary Ann Lemay (replaced by Donna Umbel), Lloyd Martin, Jack Nickels, Pauline Romanowski, Agnes Schafer, Jeanette Tressler.

Tonja Sas was newsletter editor and Agnes Schafer served as auditor.

The community was saddened upon learning that Margaret Sas died in an automobile accident in January; her daughter Tonja Sas was hospitalized.

Nolan Graves presented his plan for a mini-golf course on the block where the Cottage Cafe stood along 146th Street, minus two individual properties; BB&T Bank and a produce stand. A house on the property will be taken to 13802 Fiesta Road, renovated and put up for sale.

The CWCA audit was completed by Ann Gough. Membership at that time totaled 234.

The board decided to move the spring picnic from the first Saturday in June to the last Saturday in June.

The board continued discussion of adding a pavilion to Fiesta Park. The completion date for the new bus station at 144th Street was estimated to be June 30, 2006.

Sas named OCPD auxiliary officer of the year; Kirkland is officer of the year

Volunteers of the Ocean City Police Department Auxiliary Unit were recognized Jan. 28 at the Princess Royale for their contribution of 1,338 volunteer hours in 2022. Since the unit's inception in 1999, officers have volunteered a total of over 65,000 hours, which translates to a cost saving of over \$2 million to the taxpayers of Ocean City.

This year, Tonja Sas, an auxiliary officer since the program began, was named auxiliary officer of the year. A member of the CWCA board of directors, Tonja has retired from the Auxil-

iary Officer Unit after 23 dedicated years of service.

She also received the key to the city along with citations from Del. Wayne Hartman and Sen. Mary Beth Carozza.

Cpl. Michael Kirkland was chosen as the Officer of the Year. Also nominated were PFC Edward Newcomb, PFC Mark Cutter, PFC Kevin Herbert, and Officer Benjamin Panitch.

Cpl. Kirkland has been a member of OCPD since April 2012 and served on the Narcotics Unit and the Worcester

County Criminal Enforcement Team. After his promotion in 2022, he was reassigned to the patrol division.




