Emergency response training course begins March 21

The Ocean City Department of Emergency Services will offer its Community Emergency Response Team training program beginning March 21. This free course will help strengthen the community's resilience and preparedness.

CERT is a community-building initiative designed to empower citizens to be self-reliant in times of crisis. The program equips participants with essential skills to recognize and respond to



natural and man-made hazards within the community.

CERT members contribute significantly to town events and engage with the community, fostering a spirit of unity and pre-

paredness. Participants will receive training on disaster preparedness, search and rescue techniques, hazardous materials emergencies, and essential fire suppression.

CERT members serve as a resource when emergency services personnel are unable to reach everyone immediately following a disaster.

This free course will meet once a week in the evening for eight weeks. Applicants must be age 16 or more, and must complete an application and permit the OC Police Department to conduct a background check. To learn more about the pro-

What to do if you smell gas

Natural gas and propane are safe, reliable and convenient, and it adds to our comfort, so why does it have to smell so bad?

Natural gas and propane are odorless by nature, so for safety's sake, an odorant called mercaptan is added so that you will know if gas is escaping and recognize that a potentially dangerous situation may exist.

Natural gas and propane that have escaped can enter locations (including properties that don't have natural gas service) by migrating and entering through openings.

If you ever detect a "rotten egg" smell in or near your home or place of business, take the following precautions to help keep your family, friends and colleagues safe:

• Do leave your home or building immediately.

• Do immediately call your local emergency number (911) from a cell phone outside the home or building, or from a neighboring location, to report the suspected gas leak.

• Do not use your telephone, turn on or off the light switches, light a match or do anything that might create a spark or flame.

• Do not re-enter the building where the leak is suspected until emergency professionals give the OK.

If you see a marine mammal on the beach, here's what to do

It's that time of the year again. Seals love to enjoy our beach as much as we do and they will beach themselves to rest or to

get warm. Please stay at least 150 feet away from a beached seal.

If it seems to be in distress or you are unsure, call the National Aquarium's Stranding Hotline at 410-576-3880, the Maryland Department of Natural Resources at 800-628-9944 or the Ocean City Police Department's Animal Control Unit at 410-723-6610. You



can also call these numbers if you spot a beached sea turtle, whale or other marine mammal.

Crime tip hotline available

The Ocean City Police Department recognizes that citizens may be reluctant to notify the police about their suspicions and concerns. But often, your hunches turn out to be valuable information to the police.

If the information is urgent and time-sensitive, call 911.

Caine Woods History: 2006-2007

CWCA officers were Robert LeMay, president; Lloyd Martin, vice-president; Tonja Sas, treasurer; Mary Ann LeMay, secretary; Donna Umbel, corresponding secretary. Directors were Henry Ammermann, Irene Hansen, Lucille Johansen, Agnes Schaper and Jeanette Tressler. Newsletter editor was Tonja Sas; the auditor was Ann Gough.

Because of the storm named Ernesto, the Sept. 2 picnic was postponed to Sept. 16. Lloyd Martin reported work on the Fiesta Park pavilion would start in January. Tonja Sas reported continuing problems with traffic and parking at the new 144th Street city bus station. Donna Umbel reported that seven people went on the OCDC downtown tour in October.

Nolan Graves informed the board of his plans for his property along Coastal Highway between 144th and 146th streets. In January, our CD came due and was to be reinvested at Mercantile Peninsula at 5.25 percent for 13 months.

With a storage room to be available at the new pavilion in Fiesta Park, Lloyd Martin reported the old storage area was cleaned out and the key returned to Nolan Graves.

The Ocean City Police Department hosted its annual Officer of the Year ceremony at the Princess Royale Jan. 27. Nearly 160 guests gathered to recognize OCPD personnel and volunteers for their accomplishments and named Detective First Class Amy Gutowski the Officer of the Year.

DFC Gutowski is a 13-year member of the OCPD. She has been a member of the Major Crimes Unit for the past two years. Gutowski is known for her tireless work ethic, teamwork and advanced job knowledge.

In 2023, she was the primary detective on 35 investigations, including 12 rape/

sex assault cases and multiple other felony investigations, and assisted other detectives and the patrol division with numerous investigations throughout the year.

Gutowski dedicates herself to shaping the future of law enforcement. She serves as a defensive tactics Instructor and a drill instructor for the OCPD seasonal academy and the Eastern Shore Criminal Justice Academy, as a taser CEW instructor, and as a field training officer instructor. She earned the distinction of Eastern Shore Criminal Justice Academy Police Instructor of the Year for 2023.

Volunteers of the OCPD Auxiliary Unit were also recognized for their contribution of 1,352 volunteer hours in 2023. This year, the Auxiliary Officer of the Year award was given to Colleen Douglas, an auxiliary officer since 2013. In 2023, she donated 504 hours.

Keep an eye on overhanging trees, shrubs

Please be aware that the Town of Ocean City periodically inspects trees and shrubbery throughout the town to ensure that landscaping does not impede the public right-of-way for passage. The city's guidelines call for trees that overhang public sidewalks to have a 7-foot clearance, while those overhanging public streets must have a 14-foot clearance.

Those in violation are subject to fines and other penalties as described in the city code. For more information, call the OC Recreation and Parks Department at 410-250-0125.




