These same containers must be moved back to the edge of the building by no later than 6 p.m. that same day.

#### Scam alert!

Please be aware of an ongoing phone scam in which the caller pretends to be a commander from the Worcester County Sheriff's Office, using the name of an actual deputy, and demands money for missed jury duty or an arrest warrant.

THIS IS A SCAM! The WCSO receives reports of this scam almost daily.

### Neither the Worcester County Sheriff's Office or any law enforcement agency will demand payment over the phone.

If you receive this phone call, hang up immediately and do not arrange payment. Do not give out any personal or financial information.

Similar scams have involved impostors claiming to be with the Federal Trade Commission or the IRS. If you believe you may have been a victim of a telephone scam and have shared personal or financial information, call the Sheriff's Office at 410-632-1112.

# Ocean City to challenge BOEM on US Wind project

The Town of Ocean City is taking a significant step in its ongoing efforts to protect its coastline and community. The town has retained Marzulla Law, LLC to file a lawsuit against the Bureau of Ocean Energy Management regarding the US Wind project.

This action is being taken with the unified support of several key local organizations and entities, including the Caine Woods Community Association, the town of Fenwick Island, Worcester County Commissioners, Hotel-Motel-Restaurant Association, Delmarva Community Managers Association, Ocean City Development Corporation, Greater Ocean City Chamber of Commerce, Coastal Association of Realtors, the Commercial and Recreational Fishing Industry, and other local organizations and businesses that have all agreed to be co-plaintiffs in the case.

The US Wind project, which involves the construction of 114 offshore wind turbines 10.7 miles off of Ocean City's coast at 938 feet tall, has raised substantial concerns among elected officials, residents, visitors and stakeholders of Ocean City. These concerns include potential negative impacts on the view shed, local environment, tourism industry, and the fishing community. By initiating this lawsuit, the town and its co-plaintiffs

aim to ensure that all necessary environmental, economic and community impacts are thoroughly evaluated and addressed.

"We have a responsibility to protect our ecosystem, our economy, view shed and our future," stated Mayor Rick Meehan. "For the past 7.5 years we have been trying to work with the State of Maryland and the federal government to address our concerns with this project. All of our concerns were either ignored or considered insignificant. It is unfortunate that it has come to this, but the town was left with no choice but to file suit against BOEM and challenge its favorable record of decision on the US Wind project."

Marzulla Law, LLC, a firm renowned for its expertise in environmental and property rights litigation, will lead this crucial case. The lawsuit will challenge the federal government's approval process for the project, seeking to address the procedural and substantive issues that have been raised.

# Caine Woods History: 2008-2009

For the year 2008-2009, the Caine Woods Community Association executive board included Robert LeMay, president; Lloyd Martin, vice-president; Tonja Sas, treasurer; Mary Ann LeMay, secretary.

Board members were Marian Ammermann, Lucille Johansen (who resigned in January), Howard Caplan, Irene Hansen, Mark Jednorski, Joe Kostelac, Agnes Schaper, Donna Umbel, Rosalie Stuller and Joe and Annette Colantuoni.

Our liability insurance rate was \$1,500.

Hansen reported that the trams were scheduled for the annual caroling party in December.

The Margaret R. Sas memorial bench was placed in Fiesta Park.

The treasurer reported that a CD of \$13,600 was invested at Sun Trust at a rate of 4 percent.

Many homeowners in Caine Woods who are away for the winter were urged to ask the OC Police Department to check on their houses.

Ocean City Environmental Engineer Gail Blazer spoke at the March board meeting about the dunes, rain gardens and rain barrels.

The CWCA received a letter explaining the legislation on carbon monoxide detectors for new and existing residences. These detectors must be installed in residences with enclosed attached garages or homes containing any type of fuel-burning equipment.

#### Non-emergency reporting process

Ocean City's Citizen Problem Reporter can be used by the general public to submit non-emergency problems or requests for service in our town. Users can anonymously submit new requests, review existing requests, and comment on requests submitted by other users.

### Do you rent out your property?

If you rent your property to anyone at any time, the law requires you to obtain an Ocean City rental license and an OC noise control permit. This applies to online rentals as well.

Compliance with the laws, ordinances and regulations within the city and state ensures safe, healthy and habitable housing conditions in rental housing units.

Applications may be obtained at City Hall or by calling 410-289-8833.

Properties that may be in violation of rental license or a safety, building or health code should be reported to City Hall at 410-289-8855.

### Trash now collected Tuesdays only

The Town of Ocean City has implemented its winter schedule for waste wheelers. Trash is now collected on Tuesdays only. Twice-weekly collection will resume May 12.






### CWCA brick at OC Fire Station memorial
